Basic behaviour management strategies

- Consistency children are creatures of habit, they like routines to feel secure.
- Model play throughout the day.
- Praise positive behaviour frequently
 e.g. 'good building', 'good listening' etc.



- Remind children positively about what you want them to do e.g. 'sand in the sand tray'
 not 'no throwing sand on the floor.'
- Model correct social interactions with children to other children e.g. waving hello, look at my toy, let's play etc.
- Encourage turn taking games. Initially with one adult them moving to another child,
 then small group.
- Model turn taking language during free play sessions, e.g. now it's's turn', next it's
 '.....'s turn'
- Use sand timers to aid sharing.



- Model conflict solving language for children e.g. 'that was mine, I want it back', 'excuse me' 'help me' etc.
- Try to predict when a possible incident or conflict is arising. Step in and support and model correct behaviour or divert and distract.
- If a hitting incident has occurred say 'stop' 'hands down'. All attention given to hurt child. Lead child away and re direct to activity.

Remember- Use the outside area; all children need to get outside to expel energy.





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• Complete ABC observations to identify triggers for behaviour, if triggers are identified managing the behaviour can be more effectively planned.

Refer to your settings Behaviour management policy.

If a child continues to have difficulties managing their behaviour, despite practitioners consistently implementing the settings behaviour management policy and considering above suggestions.

The setting will need to consider:

- > Liaising further with Parents to consider any needed referrals and to write an individual behaviour plan.
- > Liaising with their Area SENCO, with the aim of any needed appropriate behaviour training being arranged for the setting Practitioners.
