


Talking Mats

What is a Talking Mat?

- A well-researched communication tool.
- Enables children to express their views.

• It supports children to understand, reflect and organise their thoughts and can be used to help develop positive interactions.



• Can be used with different children in a variety of settings.

• Provides a way for children to effectively express themselves in a visual way that can be easily recorded.

• A useful tool in supporting transition

Why can a "Talking Mat" be more successful than conversation? even for more able students

- Provides a structured framework for open questions
- Supports language processing \rightarrow visual!
- Reduces memory demands.
- Reduces distractibility.
- Avoids direct confrontation and direct interaction as it doesn't require eye contact etc.
- Gives the child some control.
- Allows the child to observe their thoughts as they emerge.
- Allows the child to change their minds.
- · Reduces leading.



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What to Do.....

Name the topic you are going to talk about

- Present the options ONE AT A TIME using OPEN QUESTIONS e.g.
 "What do you feel about?"/ "What do you think about?" RATHER than "Do you like?"
- 2. Give TIME to respond ... Don't rush, silence is Ok!
- 3. Encourage physical participation where possible.
- 4. ADD IN BLANKS where appropriate.....prompted by "Anything else?"
- 5. Take a PHOTO and copy for child's file
- 6. Have fun!

Things to consider....

- Distractions
- Language processing and speed
- Difficulty in thinking, listening and doing
- Visual needs
- Low mood
- Motivation
- Interest in the topic

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Getting Started

- How do they express a preference?
- · Do they have a way of expressing yes or no -

or even don't know?

· Can they make a choice in any way?



If not -



• Gather information from those who know them well - start with parent/

teacher/ support worker/ speech and language therapist - EHC plan.

· Spend time with them to try to see things from their point of view- their

experience/responses

Gaining the Voice of the child

There is never any excuse not to obtain and record a child's wishes and views – every child makes their wishes/likes/dislikes known in some way. We should never assume anyone does not have an opinion or view and it is our challenge to find ways to secure this
