Writing frames

Writing frames can be a useful tool to help children structure their writing and include certain features.

Sentence building

Sam	is	on	the	bus.	
Sam	ic	on	the	hus	

Match word cards to a completed sentence strip. Move on to building short sentences with a selection of known word cards (use strips of paper or post-it notes).


Gradually expand simple sentences to include a few adjectives/connectives: It is a red van. It is a little yellow car. I can see a big blue lorry.

Set up a writing station with a variety of writing tools, card and different types of paper available. Create a play 'office' to inspire a desire to write!


Clicker

Apps

Allow children with handwriting and/or spelling difficulties to record their ideas using apps such as Popplet (a mind mapping tool) which has a speech to text function.





Writing with purpose



Keeping a journal is a great way for children to get creative and express themselves. If children draw pictures, get them to

'tell you the story' and write it down for them to demonstrate their words are meaningful. Children can help write a shopping list!
