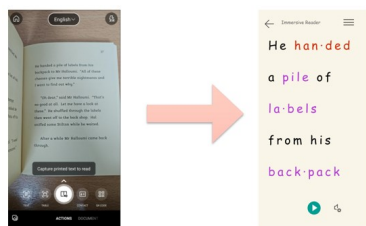
Immersive Reader

Use of *Immersive Reader* in *Word 365* supports access to text by making it easier to read or by reading it aloud on screen. These functions can also be used alongside dictating to support independent proof reading and editing of work.



Microsoft Lens

The *Microsoft Lens* app converts images of whiteboards, documents, books and clear handwritten notes into accessible documents using *Immersive Reader*.

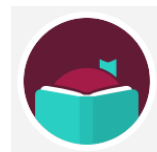

Libby

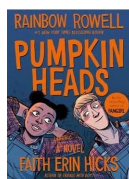
Libby is a free app that provides audio-books, magazines and comics from your local library to read anytime, anywhere! You just need a library card and the Libby App.

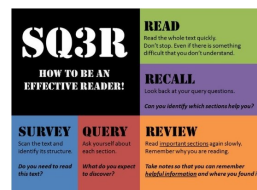
