Changes to Development Matters, the revised non-statutory curriculum guidance for the Early Years Foundation Stage (EYFS) from September 2021.

As a result of, these changes the SEN Inclusion Fund has taken away the requirement to submit EYFS tracking data from the mandatory evidence required for reviews and will now require a clear summative assessment of the child's needs (this can be either a separate setting based report or a detailed description in the 'assessing' section on the application/ review appendix's).

FUNDAMENTAL PRINCIPLES OF THE CODE OF PRACTICE- The importance of Early Identification

Statutory responsibilities – A child may have special educational needs requiring the intervention of the LEA as well as the Health Service before he or she reaches compulsory school age.



Early identification – All children with special educational needs should be identified and assessed as early as possible, and as quickly and as thoroughly as possible. Children whose needs are identified early are less likely to have serious difficulties later on.

Partnership with parents – The knowledge views and experience of parents are vital. Effective assessment and provision will be secured where there is the greatest possibly degree of partnership between parents and their children, schools and settings, LEAs and other agencies.

Pupil participation – All providers must develop procedures for involving children in decision making and exercising choice.

Inclusion – The special educational needs of children will normally be met in mainstream schools or settings. When parents want a mainstream place for their child, the education service should do everything possible to try to provide it.

Involving all staff – Provision for children with special educational needs is a matter for everyone in an early years setting or school, not just the SENCo or support staff.

Referrals to the Early Years Coordination Team (EYCT)



Children need to be referred into this team

in a timely manner if they are already known to 3 or more supporting services across education and health or you think they may need the support from 3 or more of the services connected to the EYCT.

Please check the child you are referring into the team lives in Greenwich Borough or has a Greenwich GP.

Contact this number first if you have any queries about a child's specialist health services or any Early Years Coordination Team (EYCT) queries.

If you make a referral to the EYCT and have not heard the outcome regarding this referral within 2 months, please contact this number to check what is happening.

Disability Living Allowance

Disability Living Allowance (DLA) is a main benefit for disabled / SEND children. It is there to help meet some of the extra costs of having a disabled child / child with SEND.

Please keep this in mind when working with Parents who have a child with SEND.



Disability Access Fund DAF

Three- and four-year old children who are in receipt of child Disability Living Allowance and are receiving the free early learning entitlement are eligible for the Disability Access Fund (DAF).

DAF is paid to the child's early years setting (as nominated by the parent) as a fixed annual rate of £615 per eligible child. The funding is non-transferable and does not follow the child if there is a transition to another setting during the academic year.





Universally Speaking- The ages and stages of children's communication development from birth to 5 years





Communication is the way we connect with other people. It underpins learning and development in children of all ages and is a skill that can always be developed and improved.

Learning a language is the most important thing a child will ever do. Young babies and children need to learn how to:

- Understand what people are saying
- Use words and sentences properly
- Speak clearly
- Look, listen and take turns

People sometimes assume that speech, language and communication skills develop and flourish no matter what.

This is not the case... children need adults to encourage and support development of their language and communication.
