Transitions

This is the term to prepare for all children transitioning into primary school.



It is an exciting but sometimes challenging step for all our children moving from nursery into 'big' school. It is important for all children including those with a special educational need and or disability (SEND) to have their transition well supported.

Children with more complex SEND who are generally accessing support from an Area SENCo and other services e.g. Speech Therapy, ASD Outreach, Educational Psychologist etc will normally have a transition meeting organized. This should always include their parent(s) as well as nursery Key Person/ SENCo and any other key professionals involved. During the meeting the child's strengths, interests and needs can be discussed and planned for, to enable a smooth transition for them into school.

Key reports and information are usually, with parental permission, circulated before the meeting takes place with the SENCo of the Primary School so they can be prepared with some initial information and able to clarify any points they need to.

Again, this year most of the meetings are likely to take place via Microsoft Teams due to the ongoing COVID 19 restrictions.

Other children in your setting and those with less complex SEND would also benefit from information being shared through the Early Years Transfer form (attached with Newsletter) and shared with the receiving primary school... again, with parental permission (your nursery policies may already outline procedures in relation to sharing information at transition times). The Early Years Transfer form guidance contains further information (also attached with newsletter)

REVISED EYFS STATUTORY FRAMEWORK



From September 2021 a revised EYFS statutory framework for the EYFS will be

implemented. Alongside this, Development Matters, the non-statutory guidance that has been used to support practitioners in their teaching and assessment of children 0-5 has also been updated.

The changes have been brought about to focus directly on:


- Supporting language development in the EYFS
- Reducing paperwork
- The unique nature of the Reception Year
- Narrowing the attainment gap

Of note for SENCOs will be changes in the use of the current "ages and stages" to make summative judgements around children's developmental and cognitive journeys.

The School Improvement Service and the SEN Teams will be working closely together to re-view processes linked to EYFS. There will also be opportunities in the summer term and across the 21/22 academic year for SENCOs to consider the changes, how they can work

collaboratively with their EYFS and leadership teams to make necessary adjustments and ensure the very best for all Royal Borough of Greenwich children.

Further information will follow in due course that clarifies the evidence required when submitting an application or review to the SEN Inclusion Fund or when submitting a request for an EHC needs assessment.





RBG Short Breaks are pleased to announce their updated offer for disabled children and young people, available from this April. Short Breaks are a fantastic experience for children and young people with disabilities in Greenwich to take part in exciting activities, make friends and have fun, all in a safe and supported environment with experienced organizations.

From 1st April 2021, we will have 8 organizations running a variety of services across the borough.

All our programmes will be putting measures in place to ensure the safety of children and young people during COVID-19, including social distancing, reduced group numbers and PPE where required.

The service is available to any one aged 4-17 who lives in Greenwich and has an Education, Health and Care (EHC) plan. The programmes range from 2-6 hours per session and are designed to encourage friendships, independence and learning new skills, as well as allowing parents and carers a short break from their caring role. Activities will be taking place throughout the summer and vary across each organisation. The only cost to families is the access fee charged by each Short Breaks provider, which ranges from £1.70 - £5 per hour (depending on the level of support that they require).



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
Symbol World

Our Greenlights staff have completed essential training to enable them to have the skills and knowledge to support families. They receive regular on going support and supervision.


