Early Years Inclusion Team (EYIT)

New Staff members



We would like to welcome two new members to the EYIT.

Lauren Randell – Taking on an Area SENCO role – She will be the 'Link Area SENCO' for Early Years Settings, mainly within the Central B area. She will, as all Area SENCO's, be supporting an individual caseload of children as needed in any area of the borough.

She will be starting with us in October 2019 and will be contacting her allocated Early Years Settings at some point following her start.

Emma Funnell – She is our new SEND Early Years Keyworker and started working with us on the 2nd September 2019.

This will be a new role for the team and we will be developing it as we go along. However we thought we would I let you all know a little bit about what the role. (see details on following page)



The new post of SEND Early Years (0-3) keyworker is intended to support children with complex needs and families before they attend an early years setting.

The post holder would predominately be working with families to offer a combination of the following:

- Referrals-coordination of services
- · Support in 'building' a Profile
- Support in completing Disability Living Allowance (DLA) forms
- · Support in accessing early years setting, if child has DLA or meets other criteria for Together for Two's placement (TF2's)
- Team Around the Child (TAC)/Transition meetings
- · Signposting to other services/resources and advice (telephone/email)

If anybody wants support for a child aged 0-3 who is not yet in a setting, they can get hold of Emma by either emailing the generic email which is Early-Years-

Updated information: SEN Inclusion Funding/ Disability Access Fund (DAF)

Thank you for your continued support since the introduction of the new Banding system for the SEN Inclusion Fund in April 2019.

We have recently had a brief review of some of the Administration processes around the submission of paperwork for applications/ reviews for the SEN Inclusion Fund and the Disability Access Fund.

We have identified that over the last term we have regularly received a number of applications and reviews without the mandatory evidence and have often had to chase the referrer a number of times for the outstanding information.

As a result of this from **September 2019** any application/ review for SEN Inclusion Fund or applications for Disability Access Fund submitted without <u>all</u> the mandatory evidence will not be processed and will be returned to the referrer in its entirety.

The referrer will then be required to re submit the application/ review with all the mandatory evidence in one go.

Please see SEN Inclusion Fund Information Pack and forms for more information on the mandatory evidence required for each stage/ band

Should there be a valid reason why you are unable to submit a piece of evidence then this will need to be clearly outlined in the main body of the email when you submit the application/ review.

Also, just a gentle reminder that all applications/ reviews should be submitted on the new paperwork that was sent out on 27th March 2019 (see attached)

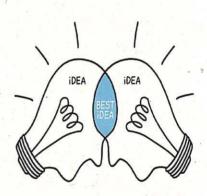

You will have noticed that you have to produce a 'timetable of support' for children in receipt of Inclusion Funding but also for when an Education Health and Care Assessment will be submitted to Greenwich Assessment and Review service.

This timetable outlines the specific and general support you are providing for a child in your setting especially when they have additional funding in place.

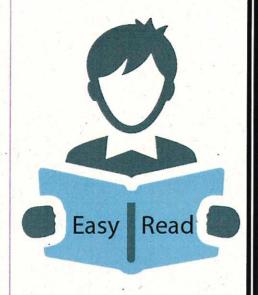


<u>Tips</u>

You don't need to write a timetable every day. Write a timetable based on usual daily practice and daily specific interventions and only update it when something changes e.g. additional hours of funding or new specific interventions e.g. a sensory circuit being put into place.

The timetable should include key strategies / interventions that have been recommended for the child included within it.

Attached are two example timetables, a blank one and a filled in example – You can choose which type of timetable you prefer to use or you could design you own.

A task box (shoe box task) is a box that contains all the materials required for a specific activity. The child can open it, do the activity, and then put the things back into the box. The activities are usually simple and structured and the child has to perform them for a short time. We can use the same task box consecutively for a few days or weeks until the child has mastered the activity. Activities in the task boxes are planned and can link in with targets on a child's PLP.
