


Getting the right kind of support: Education, Health & Care Plan



Sometimes you might need more help in school, college or training than they can give you.



If so, you might have an Education, Health and Care Plan.

- This is sometimes called an EHC plan.



What is in an EHC plan?

- The plan is about you..
- Each plan will be different..



The EHC plan will:

- Use information from your EHC Needs Assessment.



It will say:

- Who you are?
- How you communicate?



It will say:

- What you want to achieve?
- What sort of support you need?
- How much support you need?



If you are over 18 it can still help you:

- to finish your education or training.



It will also say:

- Why you need help with things?
- How often you must get support?



It will also say:

- where you go to school or college
- If you do!



Once the support is in the plan:

The support must be given to you.



All the people that support you will be able to see your plan:

- It should help them work together to support you.



It is your right:

- To say what you think should be in the plan?
- To say who you want to see the plan?



Who can get an EHC plan?

- Children and Yong People who are aged 25 years or under.
- If they need more help with learning or support than their school can give them.



The plan will stop once you are 25 years old.



Or if you:

- Go to university.
- Get a job.

Or if:

- the local authority think you do not need it anymore..



Remember!

- It is your plan.
- You can tell the local authority if you agree or not.
- The local authority must listen to you.
