ABA and the RBG Approach

The Royal Borough of Greenwich were facing a growing number of SEN Tribunal cases in which we needed to explain our approach in working with children and young people with autism in our schools.

We aim to have a child centred, eclectic approach which matches the interventions and strategies to the individual child or young person.

Our document 'The Royal Borough of Greenwich Approach to supporting the needs of Children and Young People with a diagnosis of ASD' is attached and may be useful in communications with parents or professionals concerning the ways we provide our support in schools.



Medical Guidance

Over the last 12 months the Inclusion Service has been working on developing guidance to advise schools and colleagues with supporting children who may have medical needs. These guidelines will give advice and sign-posting to schools. See attached guidance.





This programme will cover areas such as coping with change, conflict resolution, numeracy, literacy, peer pressure and friendship. If there are any behaviour concerns, we are hopeful that some of the workshops being delivered will go some way to addressing these. Our aim is for a smooth and pleasant transition for all Royal Greenwich Year 6 pupils.

To be eligible for nomination, the pupil **must be** moving on to a Royal Greenwich secondary school and meet at least one of the following criteria:

- I. Be categorised as SEN Support for behaviour (not with EHCP).
- 2. Have been discussed at Fair Access Panel in Years 5 or 6
- 3. Have been in receipt of a PSP or EHA in Years 5 or 6
- 4. Have a history of suspensions in Yr5 or 6
- 5. Have below average school attendance
- 6. Recently returned to school for EHE
- 7. Safeguarding and Social Care involvement
- 8. A looked after child (with any of the above concerns)
- 9. Known history of lack of engagement with interventions/agencies
- 10. Other vulnerable children i.e. low income, low self-esteem, bullied, DV, lack of parental input

We are asking for a maximum of 8 nominations from your school for this programme. Once all school nominations have been collated, a short-list of 100 pupils will be selected and you will be informed of the outcome in due course. If any of your Year 6 pupils are successful, it will be the responsibility of the home school to inform and get permission from parents. Find an example of nomination form and referral attached.

Y6-7 TRANSITION DAY 23rd May 2024

Please note that the Y6-7 transition day will be held at the PDC on 23rd May 2024. We would like to ensure that all SENCOs are in attendance as well as secondary DSLs. Please extend the invite to your DSL, unless you as the SENCO are the named safeguarding lead.

At the next upcoming SENCO Network meeting, we would like to discuss how best to manage the transition day and the current transition form (attached to the newsletter). We would like to ensure that the form covers all your requirements in order to avoid either additional or duplication of information, requested of Primary SENCOs by individual schools. We have allocated time for both primary and secondary SENCOs to discuss this on 23rd January, so please do attend. We would like mixed groups of primary and secondary colleagues at the tables to allow for these discussions.

At the SENCO Network meeting, we will also be hearing from both a primary and secondary SENCO on how they effectively manage their transition arrangements, in order to support their most vulnerable learners.

Offer day

We have been informed that secondary schools are often contacted directly by parents once they have been notified of their child's Y7 school place. This year the SEND Assessment and Review Team alongside the Virtual School and the ASD transition coordinator, aim to contact secondary schools as soon as they have been made aware of any vulnerable pupils attending their school (once parents have accepted a place). Primary SENCOs will also be notified so that information can be handed over at the earliest opportunity and to ensure that the above transition day can focus on the remaining SEND pupils.


